Going Deeper with God

1. What are some of the most “impossible” situations you’ve faced in your life and what made them seem so overwhelming?
2. What are some of the common ways we can try to handle “impossible” situations in our lives ... and why do we do these things?
3. Take time to read the account of Jesus feeding the 5000 in John 6:1-15. Do you think there’s any significance to the fact this is the only miracle of Jesus that’s found in all 4 gospels? Explain.
4. What were some of the reasons the situation might have seemed “impossible” to Jesus’ disciples in vv. 1-5?
5. Take some time to compare/contrast the response of the following characters to the “impossible” situation they were facing.
 - Philip (v. 7)
 - Andrew (vv. 8-9)
 - Disciples (Matthew 14:15)
6. Honestly, do you have any tendencies to respond in similar ways as the disciples did in today’s passage? Explain.
7. What is the big lesson Jesus teaches both the disciples and the crowds in vv. 10-15? What applications can this lesson have for us today?
